



POSTCARDS FROM PROVIDENCE: NO. 11

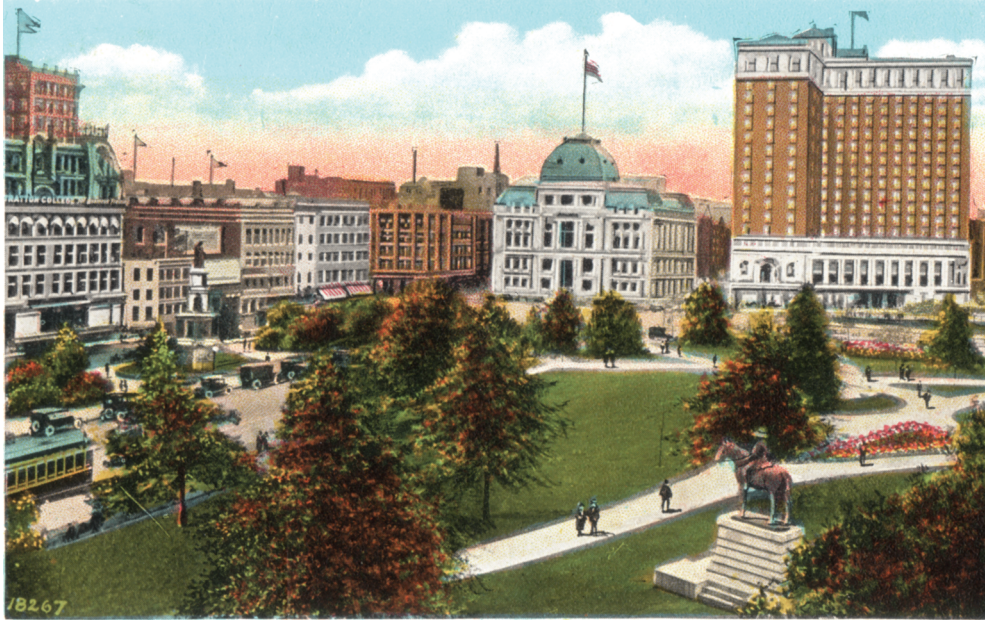
Replicas of real vintage postcards from Providence, with views of the city from the time when Lovecraft lived there. He might have sent a note on a postcard just like this.

Print on white or buff cardstock.

Fold at dashed line, and glue front of card to back. Alternatively, print double-sided using the "work and turn" method, making two postcards instead of one.

Trim at crop marks.

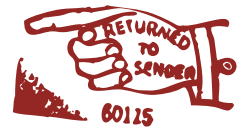
